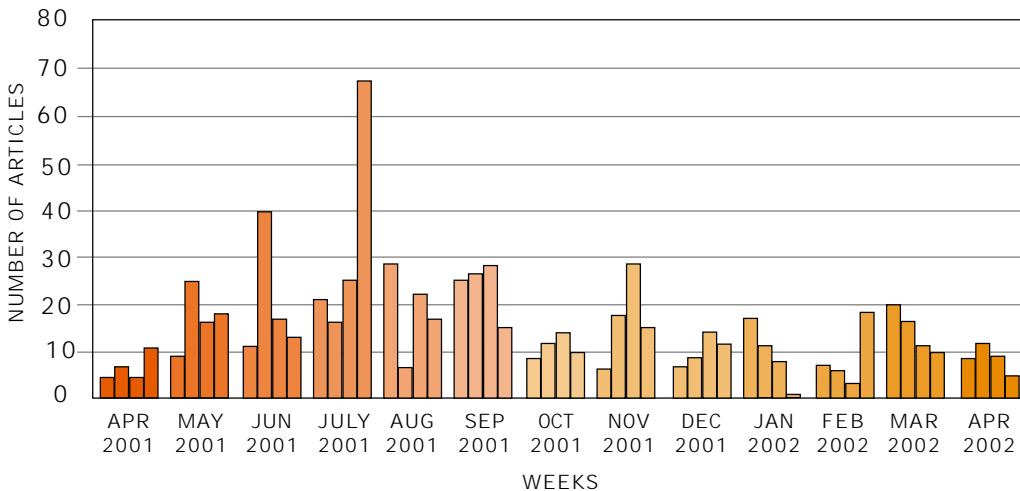

VISITS TO NEDLAC

Nedlac hosted numerous foreign delegations in 2001-2002

- Officials from the US Departments of Labour and State visited Nedlac in order to obtain feedback on the implementation of the Employment Equity Act, and how they could assist in ensuring the effective implementation of the Act.
- The Brazilian Secretary of Production Development, Reginaldo Braga Arcuri, visited Nedlac and held discussions on the way Nedlac functions, and on similar initiatives in Brazil.
- Nedlac hosted Mr July Moyo, Minister of Labour of Zimbabwe
- Ditsela women's studies group
- The Minister of Labour of Finland, Ms. T. Filatov
- Dutch trade union delegation
- Delegation from Indiana, US, on community building, led by the Governor of Indiana’s wife, Judy O’Bannon

- Study tour from the Tanzanian Government. The purpose of their trip was essentially to focus on attracting private sector investment.
- Delegation from the National Economic Council of Malawi. The main interest of the delegation was to learn how Nedlac operates.
